COUNCILMEMBER JANKE MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER BIRCH SECONDED THE MOTION TO INCLUDE THE MAYOR'S SCHEDULE IN THE OCTOBER 9, 2012 MINUTES.

**PUBLIC HEARING:**

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**#04. PUBLIC HEARING: REVIEW REVENUE SOURCES FOR THE 2013 BUDGET.**

[7:07:43 PM](#) MAYOR RARRICK DECLARED THE PUBLIC HEARING TO REVIEW REVENUE SOURCES FOR THE 2013 BUDGET OPEN AT 7:07 P.M. AND STATED THAT EVERYONE PRESENT WILL BE GIVEN AN OPPORTUNITY TO BE HEARD. THE CITY CLERK WILL BE RECORDING WHAT IS SAID. WHEN YOU ADDRESS THE COUNCIL, PLEASE STEP TO THE MICROPHONE AND STATE YOUR NAME AND ADDRESS. ONLY ONE PERSON WILL BE ALLOWED TO SPEAK AT A TIME.

STEVE MYERS, 725 SOUTH SUMMIT, STATED THAT HE IS HERE TO TALK ABOUT THE LOOMING INCREASES IN WATER/SEWER RATES AND THE STORM DRAIN ISSUE. HE STATED THAT HE IS SINGLE AND LIVING IN HIS OWN HOUSE. HE IS NOT SURE WHY HE PAYS THE SAME SEWER RATE AS A HOUSEHOLD OF SIX PEOPLE. HE STATED THAT EVERYTHING IS RISING INCLUDING HEALTHCARE, FUEL AND FOOD AS WELL AS PROPERTY TAXES. HE STATED THAT IN TWO YEARS, THE SEWER RATE WILL BE ABOUT \$110/MONTH. CITIZENS ARE NOT MOVING INTO TOWN BECAUSE THEY CAN'T AFFORD TO.

HEATHER RUSKIEVICZ, 640 NORTH ELM, STATED THAT THE RATES HAVE INCREASED, BUT RIGHT NOW IS NOT THE TIME TO PUT IN ANOTHER TAX OR ANY INCREASES.

JACK SMITH, 1870 EAST IVY, STATED THAT HE AGREES THAT THERE SHOULDN'T BE ANY INCREASES OR ADDITIONAL FEES. HE ALSO STATED THAT THE CITY NEEDS TO LET THE PROPERTY TAX STAY THE SAME THIS YEAR AND NOT TAKE THE 1% INCREASE. HE STATED THAT THIS MONEY NEEDS TO BE LEFT IN THE PRIVATE SECTOR. THERE ARE OPTIONS AND WE SHOULD CHOOSE TO DO NOTHING.

BILL PIFER, 1930 EAST IVY, STATED THAT HE ALSO OPPOSES THE POSSIBILITY OF INCREASING THE PROPERTY TAX AND HE IS OPPOSED TO THE ONGOING INCREASES IN THE WATER/SEWER RATES. HE ALSO STATED THAT NOW THERE IS CONSIDERATION OF A STORM WATER UTILITY. HE DOESN'T THINK THAT VERY MANY PEOPLE KNOW ABOUT THIS PROPOSAL. HE ALSO THINKS THAT A STORM WATER UTILITY ISN'T APPROPRIATE ON TOP OF ALL THE WATER/SEWER RATE INCREASES.

**PUBLIC APPEARANCES AND FORUM TIME:**

**#05. DISCUSSION/ACTION: REQUEST FROM THE NE WASHINGTON FARMER'S MARKET TO CLOSE ASTOR ON WEDNESDAYS.**

JOHN PROGAR, 2341 HEIDEGGER RD, RICE, STATED THAT THEY ARE CURRENTLY A SATURDAY MARKET AND THEY WOULD LIKE TO EXPAND TO WEDNESDAY'S IN THE DOWNTOWN AREA ON ASTOR WHICH IS THE LOCATION OF THE SATURDAY MARKET.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL ASKED FOR CLARIFICATION THAT THE REQUEST IS TO HAVE THE MARKET EVERY WEDNESDAY. MR. PROGAR STATED THAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO HAVE IT EVERY WEEK, BEGINNING THE SECOND WEDNESDAY IN MAY THROUGH THE FOURTH WEDNESDAY IN OCTOBER. COUNCILMEMBER FOLL STATED THAT SHE IS VERY CONCERNED ABOUT PARKING IN THIS ALREADY CONGESTED AREA.

JOHN PROGAR STATED THAT HE THINKS THAT THE BENEFIT OF HAVING THIS IN THE DOWNTOWN AREA OUT WEIGHS THE PARKING ISSUES FOR ONE DAY A WEEK. HE STATED THAT THE HOURS OF OPERATION WOULD BE 8:30 A.M. TO 1:30 P.M.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT WE MIGHT NEED TO EXPLORE ADDITIONAL HANDICAPPED PARKING IN THE AREA. HE ALSO WONDERED ABOUT A COMMENT FROM STAFF STATING THAT WE WOULD NEED TO WORK WITH THE DOT (DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION) ON THE APPROPRIATE SIGNAGE FOR A ROAD CLOSED OFF THE STATE HIGHWAY. MUNICIPAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATOR ERIC

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DURPOS STATED THAT HE REALIZED THAT THIS ISN'T CURRENTLY DONE FOR THE SATURDAY MARKET, BUT THOUGHT IT WOULD BE A GOOD IDEA TO FOLLOW UP IF WE ARE GOING TO HAVE BOTH A SATURDAY AND A WEDNESDAY.

JOHN SMITH REQUESTED TO BE ALLOWED TO SPEAK PRIOR TO ANY COUNCIL ACTION SINCE HE IS THE MANAGER OF THE CURRENT WEDNESDAY FARMERS MARKET.

JOHN PROGAR EXPLAINED THAT THERE ARE ACTUALLY TWO DIFFERENT FARMERS MARKETS THAT OPERATE IN COLVILLE.

COUNCIL DECIDED TO DEFER ANY ACTION UNTIL AFTER THE PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD.

**#06. DISCUSSION:            FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER REQUEST FOR FUNDING IN 2013.**

MARY PAGE, FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER, STATED THAT SHE IS HERE TO DISCUSS THE RENEWAL OF THE CONTRACT WITH RURAL RESOURCES FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER. SHE EXPLAINED TO COUNCIL WHAT SERVICES ARE PROVIDED BY THE FAMILY SUPPORT CENTER. SHE ALSO SHARED A SUCCESS STORY OF ONE OF THEIR RECENT CLIENTS.

FUNDING FOR THIS REQUEST IS CURRENTLY INCLUDED IN THE 2013 BUDGET.

**PUBLIC COMMENT PERIOD:**

**#07. PUBLIC COMMENT:            THE FLOOR IS OPEN FOR ANY PUBLIC COMMENTS.**

GAY INGRAM, 932 HIGHWAY 20, STATED THAT SHE WANTS TO BE ADDED AS A SERIOUS BUYER FOR THE OLD COUNTY SHOP FACILITY TO BUILD A WORLD CLASS ROLLER SKATING RINK. THIS WOULD PROVIDE A FUN, CLEAN, SAFE AND DRUG FREE ENVIRONMENT AND CREATE JOBS FOR THE COMMUNITY.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT THEY SHOULD TALK TO THE BUILDING/PLANNING DEPARTMENT. MS. INGRAM STATED THAT THEY HAVE TALKED WITH THE DEPARTMENT.

JOHN SMITH, 3831 DEEP LAKE BOUNDARY RD, STATED THAT HE IS THE CURRENT MANAGER AND OWNER OF THE WEDNESDAY FARMERS MARKET. THERE ARE TWO MARKETS WITH DIFFERENT MANAGEMENT AND PHILOSOPHIES. HE STATED THAT HE IS CONCERNED ABOUT LOCAL FARMERS AS A WHOLE. HIS GROUP HAS ALREADY ARRANGED FOR THE WEDNESDAY MARKET TO BE AT THE FAIRGROUNDS. HE STATED THAT HE IS NOT SPEAKING FOR OR AGAINST THE REQUEST THAT WAS MADE, HE JUST WANTED COUNCIL TO HAVE ALL THE INFORMATION.

TOM HARRISON, 1200 ALADDIN RD, STATED THAT HE IS ONE OF THE FOUNDERS OF THE WEDNESDAY FARMERS MARKET, HE WOULD LIKE TO SEE IT DOWNTOWN ON WEDNESDAYS. HE STATED THAT THE DOWNTOWN MERCHANTS WERE THRILLED AT THE PROSPECT OF HAVING THE MARKET DOWNTOWN ON WEDNESDAYS.

JOHN PROGAR STATED THAT THEY ARE TRYING TO PROVIDE A LOCATION THAT THE VENDORS AND THE CUSTOMERS WOULD HAVE THE BEST ACCESSIBILITY.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL ASKED ABOUT USING HERITAGE COURT AND SOMEHOW PROVIDING A WALKING ROUTE TO THE FAIRGROUNDS TO LINK WITH THE OTHER MARKET.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT IT SEEMS PREMATURE TO ACT ON THIS TONIGHT. MAYBE WE NEED TO FURTHER EVALUATE THE ASTOR STREET LOCATION AND THE CONCERNS REGARDING PARKING. HE STATED THAT MAYBE A YEAR FROM NOW, WE COULD RE-EVALUATE AFTER THE FAIRGROUNDS LOCATION IS USED.

COUNCILMEMBER LAWSON MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER JANKE SECONDED THE MOTION TO APPROVE THE REQUEST TO CLOSE ASTOR BETWEEN THE ALLEY AND MAIN STREET ON WEDNESDAYS

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FOR THE NE WASHINGTON FARMERS MARKET, STARTING THE 2ND WEDNESDAY IN MAY, 2013 UNTIL THE 4TH WEDNESDAY IN OCTOBER.

**UNFINISHED BUSINESS:**

**#08. DISCUSSION/ACTION: PROPOSAL REGARDING JOHN ACORN COURT/WAY.**

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT HE REVIEWED THE PROPOSED SITE AND HAS AN ISSUE WITH THE HEIGHT. HE SUGGESTED THAT THE SIGN BE MOVED TO THE RIGHT (SOUTH) ABOUT 2 FEET SO IT DOESN'T BLOCK THE CLOCK AND LOWER IT TWO FEET.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER BIRCH SECONDED THE MOTION TO APPROVE THE SIGN REGARDING ACORN COURT AS PROPOSED, CHANGING THE HEIGHT OF THE SIGN TO 6 FEET HIGH AND PLACING THE SIGN TWO FEET TO THE SOUTH OF THE PROPOSED LOCATION.

FOR CLARIFICATION, THE SIGN WILL BE NO TALLER THAN SIX FEET AT THE TOP OF THE SIGN.

FIRE CHIEF JEFF PITTS STATED THAT THE FLSA (FAIR LABOR STANDARDS ACT) HAS A 20% RULE FOR A STIPEND FOR VOLUNTEER STIPENDS. IT STATES THAT WE CAN'T COMPENSATE A VOLUNTEER ABOVE 20% OF WHAT YOU WOULD PAY A REGULAR EMPLOYEE. HE STATED THAT THERE IS NO HISTORY THAT CAN BE FOUND TO EXPLAIN HOW THE COMPENSATION WAS ESTABLISHED 20+ YEARS AGO.

COUNCILMEMBER BERGIN MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER LAWSON SECONDED THE MOTION TO ADOPT PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 1481 N.S. ESTABLISHING THE OFFICES OF FIRE CHIEF, SECRETARY AND TRAINING OFFICER FOR THE COLVILLE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT.

COUNCILMEMBER BERGIN ASKED IF WE SHOULD ADVERTISE THIS PUBLICLY.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL STATED THAT THIS IS A GOOD OPPORTUNITY TO WORK WITH TEDD ON ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT ISSUES. SHE ASKED THAT THE MAYOR WORK DIRECTLY WITH TEDD ON THE POTENTIALS FOR THIS PROPERTY.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER FOSTER SECONDED THE MOTION TO DIRECT THE MAYOR TO DIRECT THE STAFF TO LET ALL INTERESTED PARTIES KNOW THAT WE WILL ACCEPT OFFERS ON THE OLD COUNTY SHOP FACILITY THROUGH NOVEMBER 30, 2012.

**#11. DISCUSSION/ACTION:      REVIEW OF THE FINAL FACILITIES MAINTENANCE INVENTORY.**

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT HE DOESN'T THINK THIS IS COMPLETE. HE STATED THAT THE GOAL WAS TO HAVE AN INVENTORY OF OUR BUILDINGS INCLUDING THE TYPE, AGE, EXPECTED LIFE AND REPLACEMENT CYCLE WITH A PROPOSED COST. HE STATED THAT THIS ALSO DOESN'T MATCH THE CAPITAL FACILITIES PLAN. SOME OF THESE ITEMS ARE LISTED FOR THE 2013 BUDGET. THE PLAN NEEDS TO EVALUATE THE MAJOR SYSTEMS SUCH AS THE ROOF, HVAC, ELECTRICAL, PLUMBING, WINDOWS AND DOORS, ETC.

MUNICIPAL SERVICES ADMINISTRATOR ERIC DURPOS STATED THAT THERE IS SOME MORE DETAILED WORK TO BE DONE WITH THE DEPARTMENT HEADS. HE UNDERSTANDS THAT THE COUNCIL IS LOOKING FOR MORE DETAILS ON THE BUILDINGS AND NOT NECESSARILY MAINTENANCE ISSUES. FURTHER WORK WILL BE DONE AND THIS INFORMATION WILL BE BROUGHT BACK TO COUNCIL. COUNCILMEMBER JANKE OFFERED TO WORK WITH ERIC DURPOS TO FURTHER REFINE THIS DOCUMENT.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL STATED THAT WE NEED TO ESTABLISH A TRACKING OF MAJOR MAINTENANCE ISSUES THAT HAVE BEEN DONE ON ALL BUILDINGS LIKE THE ROOF AND HVAC SYSTEMS, ETC.

**#12. DISCUSSION/ACTION:      PROPOSED ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE 2013-2018 CAPITAL FACILITIES PLAN EXECUTIVE SUMMARY.**

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE ASKED ABOUT THE PROPOSED STORAGE SHED AT THE AIRPORT AND WHY IT IS NEEDED. COUNCILMEMBER BIRCH STATED THAT THERE ARE MATERIALS SITTING OUTSIDE IN THE WEATHER THAT THEY NEED TO BRING INSIDE. COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT THERE IS NO RATIONALE PROVIDED FOR THE ITEMS OR ANY SPECIFICS ABOUT THEM. HE STATED THAT THIS PLAN HAS NO SUBSTANCE.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER BERGIN SECONDED THE MOTION TO ADOPT PROPOSED ORDINANCE NO. 1482 N.S. ADOPTING THE 2013-2018 CAPITAL FACILITIES PLAN (CFP) EXECUTIVE SUMMARY.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT THE PROPOSAL IS NOT CONSISTENT WITH THE PRIORITIES.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL STATED THAT WE NEED TO LOOK AT SOME OF THE CFP ITEMS FOR POSSIBLE SET ASIDE FUNDING.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE REITERATED THAT THERE IS \$39,375 ENGINEERING SERVICES IN THE CURRENT EXPENSE BUDGET. HE WOULD LIKE TO LOOK AT LEAVING \$10,000 IN THE ACCOUNT THAT WOULD FREE UP \$29,375 FOR OTHER ISSUES. HE STATED THAT HE WAS CONSIDERING THAT IT GOES TO STREETS, BUT MAYBE IT SHOULD BE BANKED AND SET ASIDE FOR CFP ITEMS. HE STATED THAT THE COUNCIL NEEDS TO MAKE A DECISION. COUNCILMEMBER JANKE ASKED IF THE MAYOR HAD ANY GOALS THAT SHE WAS HOPING TO PURSUE IN 2013.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL STATED THAT THE COMMITTEE HAS BEEN WORKING ON THE FEE CHARTS AND SHE WOULD LIKE TO DISTRIBUTE THAT THIS WEEK TO STAFF AND THEN IT WILL COME BACK TO COUNCIL.

**INDIVIDUAL REPORTS BY MAYOR, COUNCILMEMBERS AND STAFF:**

CITY CLERK HOLLY PANNELL REMINDED EVERYONE THAT THE 2011 AUDIT EXIT CONFERENCE IS TOMORROW MORNING AT 9 A.M. AT CITY HALL.

COUNCILMEMBER JANKE STATED THAT DUE TO THE INCREASING CONCERN OVER WATER/SEWER RATES AND THE PROPOSED STORM WATER UTILITY, HE IS GOING TO WORK WITH ERIC DURPOS TO DEVELOP A WHITE PAPER WITH FACTS. HE STATED THAT HE HAD A MEETING WITH ERIC DURPOS, COUNCILMEMBER BIRCH AND COUNCILMEMBER LAWSON ON THE STORM WATER UTILITY AND REVIEWED THE COMMUNICATION PLAN AND THE NEXT STEP IS AN OPEN HOUSE. HE STATED THAT THEY ARE HOPING TO SCHEDULE THIS SOMETIME AROUND THE FIRST PART OF DECEMBER. THEY ALSO DISCUSSED THE NEED TO DEVELOP A STRATEGY TO DEAL WITH THE STORM WATER DILEMNA.

COUNCILMEMBER FOLL STATED THAT SHE DISTRIBUTED THE INFORMATION ON THE PROPERTY TAX EXPLANATION. SHE ALSO REVIEWED SOME INFORMATION SHE PROVIDED REGARDING TRANSPORTATION BENEFIT DISTRICTS, WHICH ARE SIMILAR TO AN LID AND CAN BE DONE TO REPAIR STREETS.

HEATHER RUSKIEVICZ SUGGESTED THAT WE CREATE AN ADOPT A POTHOLE PROGRAM AND PROVIDE CITIZENS WITH THE INFORMATION REGARDING COSTS.

MAYOR RARRICK STATED THAT SHE IS CONSIDERING ASKING THE COUNCIL TO FOREGO THE 1% PROPERTY TAX INCREASE.

COUNCILMEMBER FOSTER STATED THAT HE HAS A GROWING CONCERN ABOUT THE BUDGET PROCESS. HE STATED THAT WE MIGHT NEED TO START CUTTING SOME PROGRAMS TO ACCOMPLISH THE MAIN CONCERNS.

AS THERE WAS NO FURTHER BUSINESS TO COME BEFORE THE COUNCIL, COUNCILMEMBER FOSTER MOVED AND COUNCILMEMBER BIRCH SECONDED THE MOTION TO ADJOURN THE MEETING.
